



### Learn to Ice Fish (WI)

This five-session workshop will teach you the basic skills to find and catch fish through the ice and prepare them for the table. The workshop is broken into segments, including two indoor sessions, two ice fishing outings near Madison and one cooking class. Fishing licenses will be waived for anglers with less than two years of fishing experience, but participants must obtain a DNR Customer Identification Number.

Refreshments and ice fishing gear will be provided.

• Monday, Feb. 12, 5:30 - 9 p.m. Velma Hamilton Middle School Culinary Arts Room, 4801 Waukesha Street, Madison, WI

Anglers must attend the indoor sessions to be eligible for the fishing outings and cooking session. This class is free. Your registration confirms your attendance.

### **Prepare to Ice Fish**

Visit the DNR's Fish Equipment for Loan webpage to find a loaner site with ice fishing equipment. Locations with ice fishing equipment will have an "IF" next to their name. Essential gear is available; however, sites do not offer ice augers. Hours and available equipment vary, so contact the site in advance and create a plan to pick up the gear. Continue the fishing fun after Free Fishing Weekend by purchasing a fishing license.

The next Free Fishing Weekend will take place June 1 - 2, 2024.

### Inland Trout early catch and release season open

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin DNR reminds anglers that early catch and release season for inland trout is open. On designated inland waters, anglers can target any of Wisconsin's four inland trout species through May 3, 2024 using artificial tackle only. Any trout caught need to be immediately released. Check the Guide to Wisconsin's Trout Fishing Regulations for more information. Once the general hook and line season opens on May 4, 2024, anglers can keep the trout they catch, provided length requirements are met and bag limits are observed.

Anyone wishing to participate in the season will need a 2023-2024 fishing license and an inland trout stamp. which are good until March 31, 2024, and can be purchased through Go Wild, the DNR's license portal, or an authorized license agent. As of April 1, 2024, anglers will need a 2024-2025 fishing license and inland trout stamp. All anglers are encouraged to continue to practice responsible catch and release and reduce their reel and fish handling time as much as possible. ### Understanding Fisheries Management in the United States

### Why do we manage U.S. fisheries?

Under U.S. law, NOAA Fisheries is responsible for managing marine fisheries within the U.S. exclusive economic zone, the more than 4 million-square-mile zone that extends from 3 to 200 nautical miles off the coast of the United States. Individual states are generally responsible for fishery management from their coastline out to three miles. We work with federal, regional, state, and territorial partners to ensure the sustainable management of U.S. fisheries in the EEZ.

#### We manage U.S. fisheries to:

Sustain, protect, and increase domestic seafood supply. Maintain and enhance recreational and subsistence fishing opportunities. Protect ecosystem health and sustainability. Create jobs, support related economic and social benefits, and sustain community resilience.

To meet these goals, we need to make sure that fish populations stay above a certain level (not overfished) and keep harvest rates at a level that allows the fish to produce its maximum sustainable yield (no overfishing). Under our science-based fisheries management process, we've made great strides ending overfishing and rebuilding fish stocks. Overfishing and overfished numbers remain near record lows, and we've rebuilt 41 fish stocks since the year 2000.



### Trivia Answers -

### (Continued from page 9)

- 1. True. 22,300 square miles. Nobody knows how deep Lake Michigan is, but the deepest point is measured at 925 feet.
- 2. Nearly 1,500 known shipwrecks, many of which remain submerged in its depths to this day. The lake has claimed many vessels over its long history, from ships of the fur trade to barges and schooners.
- 3. The Petoskey Stone is a unique and beautiful fossil of the Devonian era. It can only be found in Lake Michigan, specifically around the northern region of the lake and its islands. Petoskey Stones were originally coral colonies, but over millions of years, they fossilized and can now be found on the lake's beaches.
- 4. 4 states: Wisconsin, Michigan, Illinois and Indiana
- 5. While the popular perception is that Lake Michigan and Lake Huron are two separate lakes, they are, in fact, one body of water. They are joined by a 5-mile wide and 295-foot deep strait called the Straits of Mackinac (where visitors can find a strategic colonial fort). So forms hydrologically the same lake and, therefore, the largest of the 'Four' Great Lakes.
- 6. 1,650 miles of shoreline, making it the "Third Coast" after the shorelines of the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans.
- 7. Evidence shows that The Great Lakes were actually formed by glaciers that melted after the last Ice Age. Increasing global temperatures during this time caused glaciers to drift and scrape the earth, resulting in the formation of the lake basins. As temperatures continued to increase, the glaciers then fully melted, creating The Great Lakes we know and love today.

## **Snowmobilers: Sled Safe This Season**

**MADISON, Wis.** – As Wisconsin receives measurable snowfall and many trails are anticipated to open for the first time this season, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is reminding snowmobilers to operate within their limits, stay sober and ride only on designated trails.

In the early months of 2023, there were 16 fatal snowmobile crashes, with 10 involving alcohol. Alcohol affects your risk perception and reaction time. If you choose to consume alcohol, wait until after you've safely returned home—it could save your life.

"Excessive speed, alcohol use and inexperience contribute to snowmobile crashes. Remember to ride responsibly and look out for yourself and others. Sober riding is always the best policy," said Lt. Jake Holsclaw, DNR Off-Highway Vehicle Administrator. "Snowmobiles and drinking don't mix. Making the smart choice and abstaining from alcohol can save your life. Impairment of any kind, either by drugs or alcohol, can have tragic consequences."

#### **Early-Season Ice Safety Reminders**

- Remember that ice is never completely safe under any conditions.
- The DNR does not monitor ice conditions. Contact local sport shops to ask about conditions locally on the lake or river you want to cross.
- Wear proper clothing and equipment, including a life jacket or float coat should you fall through the ice and to help retain body heat.
- Do not travel in unfamiliar areas.
- Slow down when traveling at night.

- Know if the lake has inlets, outlets or narrows that have currents that can thin the ice.
- Watch for pressure ridges or ice buckling. These can be dangerous due to thin ice and open water.

In addition to these ice safety tips, the DNR reminds riders to check trail conditions ahead of time by contacting your county forestry and/or parks department, local snowmobile clubs, or viewing <u>Travel Wisconsin's Snow</u> <u>Report</u>.

Remember – operating a snowmobile off a designated trail is considered trespassing and can damage private property.







## Thirteen ice fishing safety tips you need to know

During the winter months, frozen lakes host a flurry of outdoor activities. Anglers, ice shanties, and recreational vehicles are a common scene.

While many enjoy winter activities on the ice, these activities can lead to serious injury if the proper precautions aren't taken.


Before you head out on the ice this winter, check out these safety tips.

- y ss h the ss
- Share your fishing plans. It's a good idea to share your plans with your family, friends, or neighbors. Let them know: The name of the lake you'll be fishing on; The location of your fishing hot spot (i.e. north shore, south shore, etc.); and When you plan to arrive home. If the fish are actively biting and you decide to stay out longer, notify them of your change in plans.
- 2. Bring a friend. When going ice fishing, never go alone. A friend can: Provide an extra set of hands; Help you stay focused on safety; and Alert authorities if something goes wrong.
- **3. Talk to the locals.** They can provide information on ice thickness, water movement, and other information pertinent to the lake.
- 4. Follow these ice thickness guidelines. Remember, ice is never 100% safe. Ice thickness can change very quickly.

2" or less - STAY OFF!

- 8" 12" Car or small pickup
- 4" Ice fishing or other activities on foot 5" - Spowmobile or ATV
- 12" 15" Medium truck
- 5" Snowmobile or ATV
- 5. Purchase a flotation suit. A flotation suit is the most important item you can buy. If you fall through the ice, a flotation suit will keep you warm and make it easier to escape the frigid water.
- 6. Carry a pair of ice picks/rescue claws. Keep a quality pair of ice picks with you at all times. If you fall through the ice, ice picks make it possible for you to climb out. Don't skimp on this life saving device.
- 7. Carry a throw rope. A throw rope can be used to pull a fellow angler to safety.
- 8. Leave the lake before dark. Navigation at night can be treacherous. Without familiar visuals or a navigation device, you can become disorientated making it difficult to find your way off the ice.
- **9. Install proper ventilation.** If your ice shanty is heated, make sure you have good ventilation. A poorly ventilated shanty can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning.
- **10. Bring a portable power bank battery charger.** Cold temperatures can quickly drain your smartphone battery. A quality charger can save the day. I would recommend buying a high capacity charger. While they're a bit more expensive, they can provide multiple charges, and can charge multiple phones at one time. To avoid permanent damage, turn your phone off in extremely cold temperatures.
- **11. Respect the ice auger.** Ice augers are built to drill holes quickly and efficiently. Before operating it for the first time, read the owner's manual. In addition, avoid wearing loose clothing or jewelry. When you are finished with the auger, store it in a safe place. Lastly, always maintain sharp blades to avoid injury while drilling.
- **12. Stay hydrated.** Staying hydrated is very important. Dehydration can happen quickly in cold weather because your body is working hard to stay warm.
- **13. Layer up.** Selecting the right number of layers is important. Beginners to winter activities tend to underdress, especially if it's a sunny day. Choosing the right number of layers, based on temperature, can only be accomplished through trial and error. Before venturing out on the ice practice at home.



A record amount of \$1.09 billion dollars is being distributed to the states for conservation purposes through the Federal Pittman-Robertson and Dingell-Johnson programs. Under those programs, sportsmen and women pay 11% excise taxes on firearms, ammunition and fishing equipment. Wisconsin will be receiving \$32.4 million this year, \$19.6 million for wildlife restoration and \$12.8 for fish restoration efforts. That is a 10% increase in funding over the previous year. 
